

# MAJOR SILK ROAD CROSSROADS

Historical Trade Hubs & Cultural Intersections

## Chang'an (Xi'an)

**Region:** China (Eastern Terminus)

**Significance:** Departure point for caravans; center of Tang dynasty administration and manufacturing.

## Dunhuang

**Region:** Gobi Desert Edge

**Significance:** Strategic junction of Northern and Southern routes; major center for Buddhist art and pilgrimage.

## Kashgar

**Region:** Tarim Basin

**Significance:** Convergence of routes crossing the Pamir Mountains and Taklamakan Desert; vital market hub.

## Samarkand

**Region:** Central Asia (Sogdiana)

**Significance:** Wealthy merchant city; known for paper production and Islamic scholarly advancement.

## Baghdad

**Region:** Mesopotamia

**Significance:** Scientific and commercial heart of the Abbasid Caliphate; link between Persia and the West.

## Constantinople

**Region:** Byzantium (Western Terminus)

**Significance:** Gateway to Europe; major maritime and terrestrial port for silk, spices, and luxury goods.
