1440

The Printing Press

Johannes Gutenberg introduced movable type to Europe, sparking the Information Revolution and the spread of literacy.

1769

Steam Engine

James Watt patented an improved steam engine design, driving the Industrial Revolution and transforming manufacturing and transport.

1876

The Telephone

Alexander Graham Bell successfully transmitted the first intelligible speech, revolutionizing global communication.

1879

Incandescent Light Bulb

Thomas Edison developed a practical, long-lasting electric light, fundamentally changing how humans live and work after dark.

1903

The Airplane

Orville and Wilbur Wright achieved the first controlled, sustained flight of a powered, heavier-than-air aircraft.

1928

Penicillin

Alexander Fleming discovered the first true antibiotic, ushering in the age of modern medicine and saving millions of lives.

World Wide Web

Tim Berners-Lee invented the system of interlinked hypertext documents, creating the modern internet era.
