

# HUMAN LIVER ANATOMY: LOBES

## Right Lobe

The largest lobe of the liver, accounting for approximately five-sixths of the organ's volume. It is separated from the left lobe by the falciform ligament on the superior surface.

## Left Lobe

Smaller and more flattened than the right lobe. It is situated in the epigastric and left hypochondriac regions of the abdomen.

## Caudate Lobe

Located on the upper posterior surface of the right lobe. It is situated between the inferior vena cava and the fossa for the ligamentum venosum.

## Quadrate Lobe

Located on the lower surface of the right lobe. It is functionally related to the left lobe and is bounded by the gallbladder and the ligamentum teres.
