<b>ANATOMICAL FEATURE</b>	<b>DESCRIPTION &amp; BOUNDARIES</b>
<b>Left Lobe</b>	Separated from the right by the falciform ligament; smaller and flattened.
<b>Right Lobe</b>	The largest lobe; makes up the bulk of the posterior and superior surface.
<b>Caudate Lobe</b>	Located on the upper posterior surface; situated between the IVC and the ligamentum venosum.
<b>Quadrato Lobe</b>	Located on the lower posterior surface; bounded by the gallbladder and the ligamentum teres.
<b>Porta Hepatis</b>	The "gateway" to the liver containing the hepatic artery, portal vein, and common hepatic duct.
